 - (b) Explain the function of the motor neuron in the body. (2 marks)

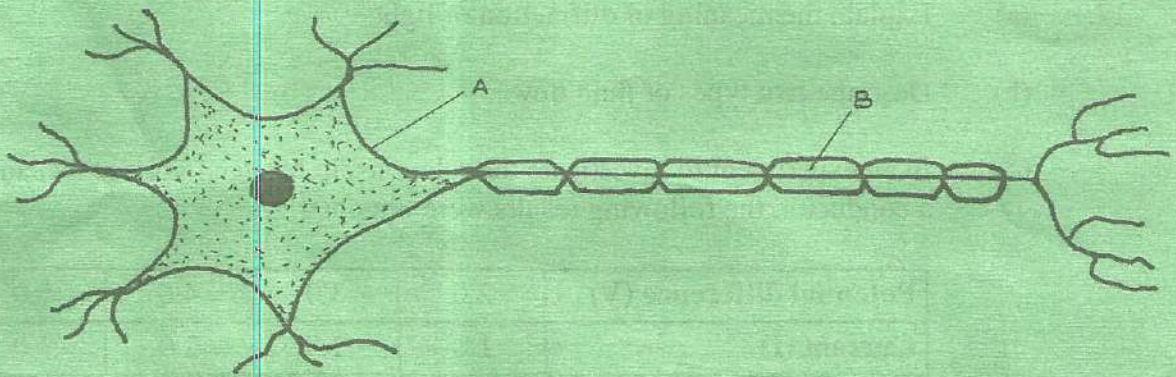

16. (a) Figure 2 shows the internal structure of a broad bean seed. Identify the parts labelled A, B, C and D. (4 marks)

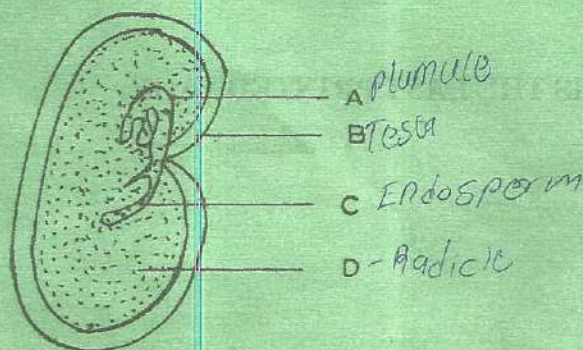
