13. In 2017 and 2018, massive fires swept across the Aberdare forest, killing animals and destroying vegetation. The forest not only provides water for most households in Kenya but also provides a habitat for wild animals. Community members from the northern part of Aberdare forest in central Kenya were among the first responders to help put out the fire. However, they faced a myriad of challenges and the fire caused a destruction of over 550 hectares (1.359 acres) of the forest. The failure to efficiently respond to the disaster necessitated the need for members to be trained in disaster management.
